Candidates are expected to have established an exemplary track record both in research (as evident from high quality publications) and in teachings. The candidate should hold a Ph.D. and Postdoctoral training abroad.

Accepted applicants will be expected to initiate research, teach, apply for grants and take a part in all department activities.

Applicants should submit:

- A cover letter describing existing and planned areas of research, as well as potential contribution to the Department of Criminology
- A curriculum vitae with a list of publications (see guidelines)
- A teaching statement which includes teaching interests and previous teaching experience as well as, results of teaching evaluation (if available)
- Copies of 3 published articles
- Two letters of recommendations including contact information
