

Call for Proposals:
The Israeli Society of Criminology Bi-Annual Meeting, May 19-20, 2021
Challenges in Criminology and Criminal Justice

The Israeli Society of Criminology is pleased to invite you to its Bi-Annual Meeting, which will be held on May 19-20, 2021. The meeting will focus on current challenges in criminology and criminal Justice (such as the COVID-19 crisis and its effects on crime and law enforcement), and will provide a platform for presenting scientific and professional activity in the field of criminology in Israel.

We welcome submissions from various disciplines and those using a variety of theoretical and methodological approaches. Proposals may be submitted for individual presentations, full panels, round tables and posters related to the conference theme. Proposals will be subjected to peer review.

Proposals for individual presentations: Should include a title, abstract (up to 200 words), 3 keywords (may be drawn from the list below), presenter's name and affiliation. Abstracts should include a description of the topic, as well as the research method and findings (if applicable).

Proposals for full panels: Must include either 4 presentations or 3 presentations and a discussant. Panel proposals should include a title, abstract (up to 200 words), keywords, chair's name and affiliation, discussant's name and affiliation (if relevant), as well as full information for all individual presentations as detailed above. **The committee encourages proposals for full panels, as they allow for optimal integration of related presentations.**

Proposals for round tables: Proposals for an open discussion between the panelists and the audience. Round tables are suitable for discussion of general topics or multi-partner research projects. Proposals should include title and abstract (up to 200 words), 3 keywords, names and affiliation of the chair and all panelists. A Round table session should ideally include 4-5 participants (chair included).

Proposals for posters: Should include a title, abstract (up to 200 words), keywords, presenter's name and affiliation. Posters should present work in progress or preliminary findings.
